Typical Junior Courses

- Continue World Language
- Social Studies Electives
- Any other classes to fill schedule that align with career/personal interests
- *If admitted to a block class, this will be automatically scheduled for you

Overall Credits: 21 credits at the end

Remember: You must have at least 5 courses for each semester.

CHS Guidance

Guidance offices are located in each unit. The guidance counselors encourage students to make use of its services. These may include personal counseling, career planning, academic concerns and post-high school planning.

Counselors are available during regular school hours and usually after school by appointment. To see your counselor, make an appointment personally. Many times you will be able to drop in between classes or during your lunch period or study hall. From time to time, you will be called to the guidance office to see if your counselor may be of assistance to you. Each counselor meets with his or her students each year. These sessions are either group or individual contacts. The Guidance Department attempts to create an open door atmosphere for both students and faculty.

For CCP English classes offered at CHS:

- Request the CCP class in HAC.
- Complete the Intent to Participate Form by April 1.
- Finish WSU's the application process by WSU's deadline.

For any other CCP classes, you must also complete the Intent to Participate form and the college's CCP application.

IMPORTANT: Request a full high school schedule now. You'll meet with your counselor to make adjustments later.

Summer School

If you plan to take a summer school class, you do <u>not</u> need to request this class in Home Access Center for next year.


Home Access Center (HAC): Entering Course Requests 1. Access HAC at http://hac.centerville.k12.oh.us/homeaccess
